### **Notice from the Ota Police Station**

Hello, this is Police Patrol! We ask for your understanding and cooperation!



The "Police Patrol" refers to uniformed police officers on duty at your local "kouban"/"chuzaisho" who visit each house individually to inquire about the following things to ensure a safe and secure neighborhood. Some matters may include:

- Family conditions/affairs
- Confirmation of emergency contacts
- Any requests, concerns, etc. you may have with the police, etc.

## "Police Patrol" Q&A



#### When will they come visit my home?

Police officers will not only visit on weekdays, but may also come on weekends. They will mainly visit during the day; they will not come during early mornings or late at night.

#### What will be asked during these Police Patrol visits?

The police officer visiting your home will ask you questions regarding the following matters:

- Confirmation of your nationality, address, telephone number
- Information concerning your family (name, date of birth, place of employment, etc.)
- Confirmation of your emergency contact, etc.

Please feel free to address any requests or concerns with the police.

#### What does the police do with this information? Is my personal information protected?

Information obtained will be recorded as Resident Information "Annaibo", which will be strictly monitored and stored at a police facility. This information will never be accessed by a third party, so please answer without hesitation.

#### I do not speak Japanese very well.

The police officer on duty will ask you questions in easy, simple Japanese. If you are not able to communicate well, you may fill out the Resident Information in your native language instead.

#### What is the purpose of Resident Information?

The information obtained from police will be used in emergency situations, such as when you or your family get into an accident; your house is damaged by a major earthquake or fire; theft while you are away; and other emergency situations. The police will use it to contact you or the recorded emergency contact(s) when there is an emergency situation.

## **Be Careful of Tire Thieves!**

Make sure you do not leave your tires in places where it can be seen from roads! Let's store our tires in a storage space that has a lock, or put on a lock, etc. on the tire itself!

## For those changing your tires



Do not leave your tires unattended! Tires left unattended in residential areas, apartments, etc. are subject to theft.

Please store them inside your house, storage area, or places hidden from sight. Furthermore, if you see a suspicious person peeking into your house or apartment area, please call 110 and report it to the police.
