Garbage Collection Stations Requests regarding use



Garbage Collection Stations are located and managed by district officers and users (managers), based on the guidelines determined by Ota City Government. We request the cooperation of users (managers) with the collection of scattered trash and cleaning etc. of the station.

The city authorities provide anti-crow nets and laminated signs to prevent illegal dumping. Contact the chairperson of the environment and healthcare committee in your district about receiving these articles. *If you live in an apartment building or other collective housing, consult the building manager.

Basic rules for use of trash stations

- Time** Dispose of the trash no later than 8:30 a.m. on the day of collection.
- Place** The location of Garbage Collection Stations is determined by the users. If you do not know the designated location, ask a neighbor or the chairperson of the environment and healthcare committee in your district.
*If you do not know the chairperson of the environment and healthcare committee, contact the Cleaning and Seiso Jigyo-Ka.
- Designated bags** Use the bags designated by the city for burnable trash and non-burnable trash. For oversized trash, affix the oversized trash disposal seal worth the corresponding fee on the trash.
- Separating** Put recyclable trash and hazardous trash into the basket and nets designated by the city.
*For details on separating, see pp. 2 – 3.
- Amount that can be disposed** The amount of trash that can be disposed of at one time by one household is about two city-designated bags (one 45-liter bag for burnable trash and one 30-liter bag for non-burnable trash).

▲ About trash that cannot be collected ▲

- To tighten rules on trash that cannot be collected, the trash truck crew will affix warning seals on this trash. We request the person who disposed of this trash to properly sort it and dispose of it on the next day for its collection.
- Trash disposed of after collection will not be collected on the same day. Take it back and dispose of it on the next day for its collection.

Items that cannot be disposed of as recyclable trash

- ↘ Unclean or partially filled containers
- Empty bottles and cans and put them into Non-Burnable trash
- For PET bottles and packaging plastics, empty them and dispose of them as burnable trash.

Garbage trucks may change their collection times and routes depending on factors such as the amount of trash, traffic situation, and weather on the collection day. Make sure to dispose of your trash at the designated trash station by 8:30 a.m. on the collection day. *Do not dispose of trash on days that are not days for its collection.

Burnable Trash



Caution

- Use designated trash bags. Trash placed in supermarket/other/other bags will not be picked up.
- Never put in glass shards or metal scraps.
- Please **empty the containers** before disposal.
- Get rid of as much water as possible from your food waste.
- For beanbags, ask for door-to-door collection or take them directly to the center.



Disposable Items

- Kitchen garbage (drain water from garbage well)
- Leather and rubber products
- Old fabric products, disposable diapers (remove human waste first)
- Plastic products (e.g. buckets, planters, hangers, etc.)
- Polystyrene without the plastic mark
- Wood waste including branches (remove roots), weeds (remove soil), and bamboo
- *Do not dispose of trees with toxicity (e.g., oleanders) or palm trees.



Disposal Method

- Make sure to tie up the opening of the bag so that its contents do not come out.
- When disposing of pruned branches, cut them to a size no larger than 60cm long and 10cm in diameter and put them into a designated trash bag, or tie them into a bundle up to 50cm in diameter and place them in a 45L bag.
- The amount of trash that each household can put out at one time is approximately two 45-liter bags.

Non-Burnable Trash



Caution

- Use designated trash bags. Trash placed in supermarket/otherbags will not be picked up.
- Dispose of spray cans, lighters, portable gas burner fuel cans, and batteries (including battery chargers) on the day for collection of **hazardous trash**.
- Dispose of vapes, electric shavers, and other items without removable rechargers as **hazardous trash**, or put them into boxes for collection of small home appliances.

The listed hazardous trash items may cause fires in a trash treatment facility or collection vehicles. Do not dispose of them as Non-Burnable trash. * Mobile batteries are also hazardous trash

Disposable Items

- Glass objects, porcelain, metal objects (pots, frying pans, etc.), razors
- Umbrellas only, even if they come out of the bag, will be collected.
- Broken glass bottle and cans unsuitable for recycling
- Household appliances that fit into designated trash bags (e.g., rice cookers, electric pots, etc.) *Items subject to the Home Appliance Recycling Law, and PCs are not accepted (See p. 7.)
- Please make sure to take batteries (including re-chargeable ones) out when disposing.
- Integrated LEDs that cannot be removed (such as lighting fixtures) *If it does not fit into the designated bag, dispose of it as bulky trash

Disposal Method

- Wrap glass products and knives in paper, cloth, etc. before disposing.
- The amount of trash allowed to be disposed of at one time is up about two 30L trash bags.

Oversized Trash



Caution

- Trash that is too large to fit into the city's specified trash bags is considered oversized trash.
- Please take oversized trash that has been broken down directly to the center.
- Beanbag chairs, and printers cannot be disposed of at Garbage Collection Stations. Please submit these items for door-to-door collection or take them directly to a trash treatment facility.

Disposal Method

- For disposal fees, please refer to the "Matters Concerning Oversized Trash." (See p. 6.)
- *Please contact the Seiso Jigyo-Ka regarding items not listed.
- 1. Garbage Collection Stations → Affix an "Oversized Trash Disposal Sticker" and put it out for collection.
- 2. Door-to-door collection → Apply in advance to the Seiso Jigyo-Ka "Seiso Jigyo-Ka", (TEL: 0276-31-8153) (reservations necessary)
- 3. Direct carry-in → Carry directly into Recycle Plaza (See p. 8.) (Direct carry-in costs: ¥130 per 10kg for household trash. Oversized Trash Disposal Stickers are not required.)

Hazardous Trash

Caution

Put the trash into the designated baskets!!



Don't open a hole in spray cans and butane gas cartridges for danger.

Products without a removable rechargeable battery



*Batteries can be disposed at a small home appliance recycling collection box.

Spray Cans / Lighters / Portable Gas Burner Fuel Cans

To prevent hazards during the work of collection and fires at the collection facilities, **completely use up all of the gas inside** spray cans, lighters, and portable gas burner fuel cans.

*If it is difficult to empty the cans, please consult the Seiso Jigyo-Ka


Fluorescent lamp tubes, electric bulbs, LED light bulbs, mercury thermometers

For safety, remove fluorescent tubes and lightbulbs from the device and place in its original box or wrap in paper before disposing. Place broken items in plastic bags, etc.

*Integrated LED lights that cannot be removed (such as lighting fixtures) should be disposed of as **Non-Burnable trash**.

Batteries (incl. re-chargeable and button)


- As a general rule, rechargeable batters (in home appliances) should be removed from the device before disposing.
- Before disposing of lithium ion batteries, insulate them by applying tape to their positive and negative ends.
- Batteries may also be disposed of at a recycling box at a store.
- Batteries from automobiles and motorcycles cannot be disposed of.



Before disposing of swollen mobile batteries, consult the Seiso Jigyo-Ka.



Do not dispose with trash bags for non-burnable trash!!



Dispose of them as "Hazardous Trash."

Recyclable Trash

Rinse inside well to remove any waste, and place trash in their respective specified baskets/nets according to the symbol marked on each item.

***Do not dispose of any items that are dirty or have residual matter as recyclable trash. Please check the rules for separation and disposal of recyclables.**




PET Bottles



*Transparent PET bottles for foods (please crush them if possible)

[Examples] Bottles for beverages, alcoholic beverages, and soy sauce with the mark.

Disposal Method Also collected at community centers and lifelong learning centers. ***except the Ojima Community Center**



Caution

- Items without the symbol, colored items, or dirty items should be emptied and disposed of as **"Burnable trash."**
- Take bottles for water servers **"back to the seller"** or dispose of them on the day for collection of **"Burnable Trash."**
- Dispose of caps and labels as **"Containers and Wrapping."**




Cans



*Round cylindrical cans for food (cans with a height of no more than 20 cm and diameter of no more than 15 cm).

[Examples] • Cans for beverages such as juice or beer, with the mark.
• Tea tins and cans for canned foods.

Disposal Method



Caution

- Square-shaped cans, dirty and partially oil-filled cans, rusted cans, and burned cans should be emptied and disposed of as **"Non-Burnable trash."**




Milk Cartons



*Paper cartons with a white inside.

[Examples] Paper cartons for beverages such as juice, milk, and tea with the mark.

Disposal Method



Caution

- Dispose of paper cartons that are dirty or lined with aluminum on the day for collection of **"Burnable Trash."**



Containers and Wrapping



*Items with the symbol on the container, exterior, or packaging.

[Examples] Food containers, colored trays, bento containers, egg cartons, tofu packs, plastic shopping bags from cashiers, shampoo bottles, bottles for detergents, PET bottle caps and labels, medicine containers, buffer materials (styrofoam), etc.


*Take oversized styrofoam boxes (with a plastic mark) to the recycling warehouse at an administrative center (excluding the Ojima Administrative Center) or lifelong learning center.

Product plastics

*Products with sides that are less than 30 cm long and are 100% plastic. (Do not cut or separate.)

[Examples] Plastic straws, forks, spoons, etc.

Disposal Method Also collected at community centers and lifelong learning centers. ***except the Ojima Community Center**



Caution

- Place these items directly into the green net without putting them into a plastic bag, etc.
- Dispose of items that are dirty or contain residual oil on the day for collection of **"Burnable Trash."**


Glass Bottles



*Food and Cosmetic and Medicine bottles

[Examples] • Bottles for beverages such as juice, beer, sake, and health tonics.
• Bottles for foods such as spices, coffee, and jam, or for medicine taken orally.

Disposal Method When disposing, remove the cap and separate into the colors shown below:



Caution

- Caps, broken bottles, dirty bottles, and containers purchased for homemade bottling should be emptied and put into **"Non-Burnable trash."**




White Styrofoam Trays



*All white Styrofoam trays for food (The trays which get stuck with a toothpick)

[Examples] Containers (trays) for fresh fish, raw meat, and fresh vegetables with the mark.

Disposal Method



Caution

- Dispose of colored or patterned trays, or white trays that are coated to be glossy as **"Containers and Wrapping(Other plastics)."**
- Take off the wrap and tape before disposal.

* Requests in use of Garbage Collection Stations *

- Please cooperate in the maintenance and management of the Garbage Collection Stations. For example, users could take turns collecting scattered trash.
- When strong winds present a risk of scattering trash, please cooperate by disposing the trash on the next day for its collection.
- Bins and netting for resource trash are distributed to the stations in correspondence with the day of collection. Please have the first person to dispose trash on that day line up all the bins and netting before disposing the trash.
- Trash disposed in violation of the rules will not be collected. If you do not understand the rules for separating and disposing, contact the Seiso Jigyo-Ka.

See p.1 for the basic rules on matters such as the time for disposing trash and the permissible amount.

* Additional information *

- Garbage trucks may change the time or route for collection depending on the amount of trash, traffic situation, weather, etc., on the day of collection.
- No trash will be collected on Sundays and from the 1st to the 3rd of January.
- Collection may be canceled in the event of typhoons, blizzards, etc. In the case of cancellation, there will be a notification on the city's website.
- Dispose of paper resource trash (newspapers, cardboard, magazines, books, miscellaneous paper) for group collection, or take it to the recycling warehouse of the nearest administrative center (excluding the Ojima Administrative Center) or lifelong learning center, or the Ota stockyard.

“Main examples of household trash” that cannot be disposed of at Garbage Collection Stations.

- Request a door-to-door collection (reservation required) or take the trash yourself to a treatment facility.
 ※ Items that cannot be disposed of at the Garbage Collection Stations.
- Beanbags, feather duvets
 Because the contents may scatter on roads and inside the garbage truck
- Printers and fax machines with toner
 Because of the danger of an outbreak of fire if the disposer forgets to empty out the toner and ink
- Gas stoves and gas fan heaters
 Because of the risk of gas leakage at the time of collection if any remains in the equipment

- Transportation to the treatment center
 ※ Trash that cannot be collected at the Garbage Collection Stations by door-to-door collection
- Home-use oil (kerosene) tanks ※ For outdoor use
 Because of the risk of leakage of residual oil during loading and unloading work, and transportation
- Portable toilets
 To be brought in by the user only, for sanitary considerations
- Pet litterbox sand ※ Mineral and silica types
 Zeolite, bentonite, silica gel, etc
- Oil-fueled heaters
 Because the oil cannot be removed from the main unit.

“Examples of main types of household trash” that cannot be treated in Ota City

- Request treatment by specialized businesses
 ※ Items that cannot be disposed of at the Garbage Collection Stations, collected by door-to-door collection, or transported to treatment facilities
- Corrugated panel (containing fiberglass)
- Waste from domicile medical treatment (waste that is infectious etc.)
- Dehumidifiers using coolant, air coolers, cold storage units, cold water dispensers (water servers)
- Construction materials (including those used by amateur carpenters)
- Soil (including soil for planters), sand, stone (including pickling stones), etc.
- Fertilizers (chemical fertilizers)
 ※ Organic fertilizers derived from nature can be collected, and only by being brought in by the user
- Agricultural materials and equipment, gas-powered grass mowers and atomizers, etc.

Note Besides the “main types of trash disposed of from the home,” there are other kinds of trash that cannot be disposed of at Garbage Collection Stations due to factors such as their type and volume (size). To dispose of such trash, contact the Seiso Jigyō-Ka.

Matters Concerning Oversized Trash

Table of Collection Fees (Ojima, Nitta, and Yabuzukahonmachi areas)

Precautions for Oversized Trash

- Trash that cannot fit or be disposed of in their specified bags due to size is considered oversized trash.
- *There is no need to affix the oversized trash treatment seal on trash that can be put into a designated trash bag.
- Oversized trash with the long side of 250cm or less is acceptable.
- Do not disassemble the unit when disposing of it at the Garbage Collection Stations.
- Unless specified in the chart below, all prices are for 1 unit of the listed item.
- The term "length" in the chart below refers to whichever dimension (length, width, height, or diameter) is longest.
- Remove any batteries in oversized trash before disposal.
- For printers, fax machines with toner, feather duvet, and beanbags, request door-to-door collection or take the trash to a treatment facility.

Precautions for Door-to-Door Collection

- Please see the "Precautions for Oversized Trash" above
- Door-to-door collection is a service in which reservations are made for oversized trash to be picked up at the owner's residence in Ota City based on their request.
- Door-to-door collection requires the pre-reservation. Please reserve via Seiso Jigyo-Ka (0276-31-8153).
- Since multiple reservations cannot be made within the same month, please contact a specialized company for handling trash related to moving and large amounts of oversized trash.
- Up to 5 items can be picked up during door-to-door collection. (*Due to load considerations, for oversized trash, you can make reservations for collection of no more than four items or six tatami mats.)
- For door-to-door collection, place the items on your lot at a location facing the road on the day of collection.
- Trash is taken from your land to the truck but not from inside your house. (Please make sure your items are not stored inside but outside to be picked up.)
- If it is difficult to take a large item outside, disassembled items can also be collected, but please put them out in a way so that it can be identified as a single item.

If you dispose of oversized trash in the collection station or request door-to-door collection for it, affix the Oversized Trash Treatment Seal for the corresponding fee on a conspicuous place on the trash.

*The "Oversized Trash Disposal Sticker" is sold at stores that offer Ota City-specified trash bags for sale. Please check the service counters, etc.

*Stickers cannot be returned or exchanged.

Home-use PCs

① Request collection at a recycling counter of the personal computer manufacturer in question. (Only if the computer bears this mark )

② Inquire with ReNet Japan about having the items collected via delivery service. Apply for collection via the website (<https://www.renet.jp>).

*A delivery person will come to collect your items at the date and time you specify. If a personal computer is included in the items to be collected, the service for one box will be free of charge.

Small home electronic appliances and peripheral devices can also be collected with the computer.

③ Take the item directly to the Recycle Plaza. (There is a fee for treatment.)

*For laptop computers, you can also dispose of them by putting them in the collection boxes for used small electrical appliances.

Industrial Trash (Trash from business establishments, stores, restaurants, farms, etc.)

- Do not take to the Garbage Collection Stations.

General trash from business activities

- ① Bring general trash from business activities directly to the Clean Plaza or the Recycle Plaza. *The handling fee of general trash from business activities is 200 yen per 10kg.
- ② When you can't bring the trash in person, ask for general trash collection and transportation licensed operators. *Please visit the website of Ota City.
- ③ There are some general trashes that can't be handled by the city. *Before bringing trash in, contact the Ota-Shi Hoka Sancho Seiso Saijyo Kumiai.

Industrial trash

Since the trash can't be handled by the city, it is unacceptable to the Clean Plaza and Recycle Plaza. Please ask the specified company for disposal of it.

Guide to disposing trash *Trash that smells or is dirty will not be collected.

- For newspapers, cardboard, magazines, newspaper, and books, separate them by type and bundle each with string etc. before putting them in the proper container.
- For miscellaneous paper, put it into a paper bag or bundle it with string etc., and put it in the proper container.


Note① Remove anything that cannot be disposed of from types of paper that can otherwise be disposed of. Examples: staples, paper clips, sticky notes, indices, rubber bands, metal fittings on files, windows on envelopes, fasteners, samples not made of paper, styrofoam buffer materials, etc.

Note② Dispose of paper that cannot be recycled as burnable trash. Examples: paper that is smelly or dirty, waterproof paper, carbon sheet, paper lined with aluminum, heat-sensitive paper, etc.

Note③ Fold up cardboard before disposing.

Newspaper, cardboard, magazines, books & miscellaneous paper



Disposing Cooking Oil

•Collection Points: An administrative center(excluding Ojima Administrative Center), Lifelong Learning Centers

•Disposal Method: put oil from food in PET bottles or oil containers and dispose of at a collection box for used food oils.



①Cool the oil ②Pour it into the container ③Close the cap

[Note]

- Limited to vegetable oil from your house.
- Please completely fill the container before disposing.
- Dispose of unused oil in the original container.
- Please try and refrain from throwing away foreign substances (bits of fried food, etc.) in containers.

Ink cartridges

•Collection places: Ota City Hall, Ojima Government Building, an administrative center, lifelong learning centers, and Airys Base

- Put them into the designated collection box installed at each center.
- Objects that can be collected: Ink cartridges from all manufacturers (Recycled cartridges are also OK.)



[Note] Do not put toners into the box!!

*Put toner cartridges used in laser copiers and printers in the collection boxes of the seller, or take them to a specialized business.



Recyclable Small, Used House Appliances

•Collection places: Ota City Hall, Ojima Government Building, an administrative center, lifelong learning centers, and Airys Base



- Put into the special-purpose recovery boxes installed in various facilities.
- Collection items: Items that fit into the opening of the box (which measures 15 cm in length and 30 cm in width)



- Small house appliances cannot be returned after being placed in the collection box.
- Remove batteries (incl. re-chargeable batteries) before placing into the collection box. (Leave them attached if they are not removable.)
- Erase all personal data before placing into the collection box.
- Items that were taken apart cannot be collected.
- Limited to only items from your house.

Direct carry-in costs: ¥130 per 10kg for household trash and ¥200 per 10kg for business related trash.
*Payments only accepted in cash

- Please come with plenty of time before closing.
- As for oversized trash, it is possible to bring in items with a long side length of no more than 250 cm.
- Depending on the type of item, there is a limit to the amount that can be taken in (e.g. Tatami mat Futon, etc.).
- Make sure various types of trash are separated accordingly before bringing them into the facilities.
- When bringing in pruned branches, cut them to a size no larger than 60cm long and 10cm in diameter (Do not trash roots)
